

CENTRAL BOARD OF GEOPHYSICS.

The second meeting of the Board of Geophysics was held in New Delhi on the 10th November 1949. In the meeting, the Syllabus Committee of the Board presented a draft Syllabus for the graduate and the post-graduate course, in Geophysics in Indian

Universities. The Oceanography Committee of the Board then narrated the work done by it. The reports of the India Meteorological Department, the Survey of India and the Geological Survey of India covering their geophysical activities during 1949—50 were then read out.

The following resolutions were adopted in the meeting :—

- (i) the Board should approach the Government of India for the re-establishment of the magnetic and seismic observatories at Dehra Dun,
 - (ii) efforts should be made to send four scholars, in addition to the one already sent, for geophysical studies abroad as soon as conditions and funds permit,
 - (iii) attempt should be made by the Survey of India to manufacture tide-gauges in India,
- and (iv) a Scheme should be prepared for the establishment of Geophysical Wing, including the appointment of a Geo-Chemist, in the Geological Survey of India.

The Board appreciated the move of the Director General of Observatories to start this journal.
